# International role for National Library chief executive

irector-general of the National Library of Australia, Jan Fullerton, was elected to the position of chair of the Conference of Directors of National Libraries at the recent IFLA (the International Federation of Library Associations) annual conference in Jerusalem.

Ms Fullerton, who has been directorgeneral of the National Library of Australia for just over twelve months, is the first Australian to be elected to this prestigious international position, which she will hold until August 2004.

The Conference of Directors of National Libraries is an independent association of the chief executives of more than eighty national libraries. The group was established to facilitate discussion and promote understanding and co-operation on matters of common interest to national libraries worldwide.

Ms Fullerton said she was delighted to be invited to lead the group over the next four years. 'The Conference of Directors of National Libraries is a dynamic group that creates an invaluable forum for the discussion of issues of relevance to all major libraries worldwide', she said.

In 1999, the Conference of Directors of National Libraries commissioned Ms Fullerton to produce a policy on copyright and preservation issues which as adopted by the group at their recent meeting in Jerusalem.

In between annual meetings, the group regularly forms sub-committees to advance issues of mutual interest to national libraries — such as the role of libraries in collecting and managing digital publications.

'To represent the National Library of Australia within that international group and now to be offered this leadership role is a great privilege,' Ms Fullerton said.

The next meeting of the Conference of Directors of National Libraries is in Boston in August 2001.
