echnology is creating a new digital dance, coaxing new partners to experiment with new steps. The latest trends and issues for anyone involved in the creation, capture, delivery and use of electronic information will be explored in *Information Online 2001 Conference and Exhibition*— a highlight of the knowledge and information industry calendar.
