She is also responsible for the University's relationships with external organisations, including government and business and industry, on issues related to information technology.

Dr Griffiths has extensive experience in information systems and networking. She has appointment to the National commission of Libraries and Information Science, the National Research Council Computer Science and Telecommunications Board's project on the Information Technology Strategy for the Library of Congress, and the Michigan Information Technology Commission. Her degrees include a PhD in information science and a BSc, with honours, in physics. Both degrees are from the University College of London.

Dr Brian Hawkins is currently president of EDUCAUSE, a professional association of more than 1600 colleges and universities, dedicated to transforming higher education through information technologies. He is a management professor by training, and is the author of one book and many articles in the area of organisational behaviour. He received his Bachelors and Masters degrees from Michigan State University, and his PhD from Purdue University. His organisational work has focused on organisational structure, conflict management, communication, and performance appraisal.
