IFLA election results

Kay Raseroka, director of Library Services at the University of Botswana, has been voted president-elect by IFLA members.

She will begin her two-year term as president-elect during the IFLA conference in Boston this August. She will succeed Christine Deschamps as IFLA president in August 2003 for a two-year term.

This is the first time an IFLA president has been elected by postal ballot, under the new Statutes adopted by Council in Jerusalem last year.

On hearing the news, Kay said: 'I am honoured and deeply appreciative of the confidence that my colleagues in IFLA have shown in me. Above all I believe the IFLA membership has demonstrated its belief in the global nature of our profession by electing a candidate from Africa. I pledge to give of my best in all of my responsibilities'.

In the elections for the new IFLA governing board, the following candidates were successful: **Derek Law** (United Kingdom), **Sissel Nilsen** (Norway), **Alex Byrne** (Australia), **Ana Maria Zimmerman** (Argentina), **Jianzhong Wu** (China), **Sally McCallum** (USA) and **Ellen Tise** (South Africa).

Each will serve a two-year term on the governing board, beginning after the Boston conference in August. This was also the first time that members of IFLA's primary board were elected by postal ballot under the new Statutes.

Derek Law has served for four years as IFLA's treasurer. Alex Byrne has served for four years as chair of the IFLA Freedom of Access to Information and Freedom of Expression (FAIFE) committee. Both Sally McCallum and Sissel Nilsen have previously served as chairs of the professional board. Alex Byrne, Ellen Tise, Jianzhong Wu and Ana Maria Zimmerman will be serving on IFLA's primary board for the first time.
