Dr Vicki Williamson – pro-vicechancellor (administrative and academic support), University of Ballarat

Dr Williamson has been appointed to the new position of pro-vice-chancellor (administrative and academic support) at the University of Ballarat. Her present formal position at Curtin University is university librarian, although her role is much broader than that, including responsibility for leading and managing a major strategic priority for Curtin which is directed towards substantially increasing the University's capability for flexible delivery of programs, and delivery on-line. She also serves as the deputy chair of the Academic Board.

Dr Williamson's academic qualifications are in arts, education and librarianship. Her doctoral thesis and research covered educational innovation, change management and strategic planning. Vadim Vaynerman named Endeavor director of Voyager development


