Ian McCallum and Sherrey Quinn of Libraries Alive! have been engaged as facilitators to exploit the opportunities offered by technology so that people from all levels across all sectors of the profession — irrespective of geographical or economic constraints — can contribute to the information agenda prior to, and during, the conference.

On 1 February 2002 a special purpose e-mail list for pre-conference issues will be launched. All ALIA members are invited to join the list.

Members will be asked to identify the most important service and technical issues that face them now or will need to be faced in the next twelve months.

Libraries Alive! will moderate the e-list, summarising and re-presenting these issues, and counting down to the conference.

We will endeavour to have keynote speakers' papers available online prior to the conference for comment by delegates and e-delegates. During the conference, speakers will join interactive online chat sessions. Each day the topics discussed will reflect the day's proceedings.

The final conference session will feature presentations by Malcolm Gillies (University of Adelaide) and Neil McLean (ALIA 2002 program

committee) who will draw the threads together by synthesising the remarks of invited speakers and e-list contributions.
