## Graduation 2001

orty-three students formally graduated at this ceremony. This number included the first group of trainees (10) to complete the Certificate II from the new training package and the final group (18) to complete the 'old' pre-training package Diploma in Library and Information Studies.

Since AITAFE is currently the only South Australian provider of these courses, the graduates came from a very broad geographic area, from Bordertown in the South East of the state to Yaninee in the heart of the Eyre Peninsula.

In fact it was the Yaninee graduate, Susan Denton, who won the ALIA award for Graduate of the Year. Sue who works in the Wudinna school/community library achieved this award and made outstanding use of the resources within her own library as well as resources which were accessible to her online. For example, her research project tapped into a impressive and wide

ranging resources in a variety of media as those of other students who are university based.

The ALIA Acquisitions SA prize for acquisitions related work was awarded to another country student, Jan Ward, who lives in Tanunda and works in the TAFE campus library at Nuriootpa.

This was clearly an outstanding year for country students as the final prize, the AITAFE Council Prize was shared by Marilyn Brown, who also lives and works in the Barossa Valley, and Susan Isted who lives in the Adelaide metropolitan area.

All of these students had at least a part of their course delivered off-campus with delivery technologies including print, videoconference, teleconference and online (using WebCT). Like the modern library at Wudinna, the modern TAFE course need not be confined within a central physical location.
