Director-general continues at National Library

The Federal Minister for the Arts and Sport, Senator Rod Kemp has announced the re-appointment of Ms **Jan Fullerton** as the director-general of the National Library of Australia (NLA) for five years.

'Ms Fullerton has led the National Library through a period of rapid change and I am delighted she will continue in this role, further capitalising on the opportunities afforded by new technologies and the changing role of libraries,' Senator Kemp said.

'Over the last three years Ms Fullerton has overseen a number of major achievements including significant progress towards achieving the National Library's goal of delivering services and information online to all Australians.'

Initiatives include the development of Picture Australia, an online single entry point to search for images held in a number of Australian libraries, museums and galleries, and PANDORA, an archive of online publications.

During Ms Fullerton's term as director-general, the NLA has continued to

expand its public programs through the development of exhibitions in Canberra, as well as travelling and online exhibitions. The Library's recent *The Treasures from the World's Great Libraries* exhibition exceeded all expectations and attracted record visitor numbers.

University of Queensland

The University of Queensland Library warmly welcomes **Dr Grace Saw** as the executive manager for the Physical Sciences and Engineering Library Service. Grace will oversee the Dorothy Hill Physical Sciences and Engineering and Architecture Music Libraries, as well as be responsible for the further development of commercial and consultancy services, and the co-ordination of the delivery of international services across all branches. Grace comes to the University of Queensland after four years at the Auckland University of Technology where she was the university librarian. She has extensive experience at a number of Australian academic institutions since the late 1980's — University of New England, Northern Territory University, Queensland University of Technology and University of Western Australia.
