Recent movements in the library and information sector

State Library of Victoria

Frances Awcock, State Library of Victoria chief executive officer and state librarian, will retire from public office at the end of November 2002. The president of the Library Board of Victoria, Sam Lipski, said that the board had accepted Mrs Awcock's decision with regret. Mr Lipski said that Fran had combined her long experience as a librarian with her skills as a communicator and manager to articulate a vision for the State Library as a cultural institution reinventing itself amidst the transformations of information technology.

Fran said that after the last thirteen years as a chief executive officer, and more than thirty years of public service, it was time to pursue her own interests and to give more time to family and friends. She will spend her final months continuing to build the library's corporate and public support, enhancing its services and preparing for the opening of its new and restored spaces in 2003.
