### Other activities

Play chicken 'statues' — when the music stops freeze in a chicken pose (or pose as one of the animals that they're annoying)

Make hen headbands/hats (see: J Evans, Headbands for easy play activities ISBN 0868969281)

Make cardboard beaks to wear (attach with hat elastic)

Make paper plate chickens.
