RAIS-A-MATAZZ

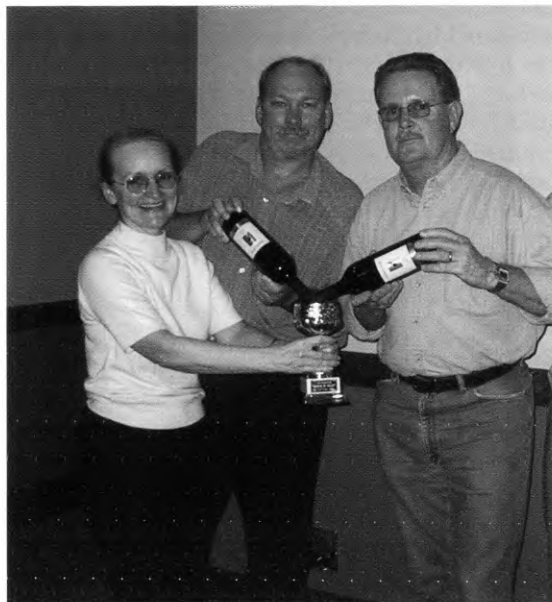

In case you wondered...

A response to my enquiry to Minister for Immigration and Multicultural Affairs Philip Ruddock about about library resources for people in immigration detention centres, specifies 'Limited library facilities consisting of reading materials and rooms, are provided at all detention centres. For example, the Woomera Immigration Reception and Processing Centre (IRPC) Library holds some 3720 items and the Port Hedland IRPC some 2852 items. The material held is in both English and community languages and includes material for children as well as adults. In addition to the books, major Australian newspapers, both English and community language ones, are available at all facilities'.

I am expecting further information from the service provider at the centres, Australasian Correctional Management Pty Ltd, about this matter. If any *inCite* reader has further information, or comment, I would be pleased to hear from you.
