## National Simultaneous Storytime

## 5 September 2003, 11:00am AEST

ational Simultaneous Storytime (NSS) was first held during Library and Information Week 2001. In 2002 NSS took place during Literacy and Numeracy Week, and as a result achieved a higher profile and increased publicity. In 2003, NSS will again be held during Literacy and Numeracy Week. The cross promotion of NSS and Literacy and Numeracy Week by ALIA and the Department of Education, Science and Training through web links, promotional material and published articles has resulted in a greater interest in NSS and will ensure that NSS 2003 will attract a wider audience and be held in an even greater number of locations

The aim of NSS is to promote:

- · the value of reading and literacy;
- · the value of books;
- an Australian writer and publisher; and
- storytime activities in public libraries around the country. Storytime is

a highly valued and utilised service to the community.

NSS 2003 will take place on Friday, 5 September 2003 at 11:00am AEST. ALIA is inviting all public library services, primary and pre-school libraries, early childhood centres and pre-schools to participate in reading the picture book, *I don't want to go school*, simultaneously throughout the country. *I don't want to go school* 

is written by popular Australian author, Christine Harris and illustrated by Craig Smith. NSS is a great opportunity to invite parents, grandparents, local VIP's, the press and community groups to participate in and enjoy the occasion, and at the same time highlight the importance of reading and literacy in children and how this can be a fun experience.


ALIA National Office co-ordinates the event including taking registrations and producing and distributing all the promotional materials. All registered



organisations will receive:

- a National Simultaneous Storytime poster featuring the chosen book;
- bookmarks for all the children participating; and
- a certificate of participation.

National Literacy and Numeracy Week (NLNW) celebrates and acknowledges the progress Australian schools, teachers, parents, individuals and the community have made towards raising the literacy and numeracy levels of all Australians. Through the NLNW Excellence Awards for schools and the Minister's Awards for Outstanding Contribution by Individuals to Improve Literacy and/or Numeracy, the commonwealth government recognises and promotes the excellent programs and commitment of many Australians to develop these skills.

NLNW is a commonwealth government initiative, which aims to:

 showcase the hard work school communities are undertaking in improving literacy and numeracy skills;

- recognise the outstanding results that have been achieved;
- raise community awareness of the importance of all Australian students developing effective literacy and numeracy skills; and
- build on national initiatives to improve literacy and numeracy standards among young Australians.

The Federal Minister for Education, Science and Training, Dr Brendan Nelson launched National Literacy and Numeracy Week on Friday 30 May. Literacy and numeracy champions play an important role in NLNW. These champions highlight the importance of literacy and numeracy in young people.
