Law authorising British archive of electronic publications visionary

CILIP: the Chartered Institute of Library and Information Professionals has praised the new *Legal Deposit Libraries Act* 2003, which extends legal deposit at the British Library and other copyright libraries to include electronic publications and other non-print materials.

Linking the old library world of heritage and preservation with the new world of electronic documents and the growth of information governance, the Act represents an important step forward for the library and information profession. With a predicted quadrupling in the UK's output of electronic journal issues between 2002 and 2005, this recognition that the national archive of electronic publications needs professional management is very timely.
