Philip Blackwell, chief executive officer, Blackwell's, UK

Philip has been CEO of Blackwell Limited, the international book distribution and retail business, since January 2000. He began his career with B Dalton Booksellers in USA before returning to the UK to work in a number of roles in bookselling and publishing with Harper Collins, HodderHeadline and Blackwell. Prior to rejoining Blackwell, Philip was director of the eBusiness and CRM team at Cap Gemini Ernst & Young.
