

ABS Public Libraries Survey 2003–04

As part of the Australian Bureau of Statistics' (ABS) commitment to providing statistics on a range of service industries in Australia, the bureau is conducting a survey of public libraries and archives in respect of the 2003–04 financial year. The last

survey of this type was conducted for the 1999–2000 financial year, with the results available in *Public Libraries Australia, 1999–2000* (cat n° 8561.0).

The 2003–04 survey questionnaire was despatched to national and state/territory libraries, national and state/

territory archival service organisations and a sample of public libraries across Australia in August 2004.

The results from the survey will provide key financial and activity measures on public library and archive services in Australia. These measures will be used by government analysts to address policy issues relating to public library and archive services. Co-operation is sought from public libraries and archives to produce accurate and timely results in order to maximise the use of these new statistics. ABS will accept careful estimates if exact figures are not available.

Data from the public libraries survey is expected to be available in mid-2005. Broader aggregate data will be available on-line, and further detail will be available on request, subject to confidentiality.


