Darling Harbour is a cosmopolitan complex: it contains restaurants, cafes, retail outlets, nightclubs, bars, conference and exhibition centre, one of the world's largest movie screens at the Imax Cinema, the Sydney Aquarium, National Maritime Museum and more. Darling Harbour has recently undergone a major facelift. It now stands alongside the Euro-style Cockle Bay complex, with the new King Street Wharf just a short walk away. Darling Harbour is also close to Chinatown, the Entertainment Centre and the Powerhouse Museum.

Getting there

There are many ways of getting to the *neXt* conference. They are: car, train, bus, plane and the new buzz of transport, by ship. Try not to go by yourself, go and find out who is coming to *neXt* and have fun while you are on your way to Sydney. Come on! What are you waiting for?


