The technical co-operation focuses on the seamless interaction between Dynix local systems incorporating the Horizon Information Portal (HIP) and the OCLC PICA Central Bibliographic System (CBS) used in many European countries and regions for the management of bibliographic union catalogues.

Elsevier and NESLi2 conclude major new agreement

The UK Joint Information Systems Committee (JISC) and Elsevier have announced the conclusion of a new agreement as part of NESLi2, the national electronic journals initiative for the higher education and research communities in the United Kingdom.

The new two-year agreement provides the framework under which the UK's universities and research communities will have electronic access to Elsevier's scientific, technical and medical journals through the ScienceDirect platform. These include many of the most highly ranked and important journals in their respective fields.

SwetsWise now an access point most cited and requested ACS journals

Swets Information Services has recently concluded negotiations with the American Chemical Society (ACS) to provide access to ACS Web Editions, the current online content of ACS journals, via SwetsWise. SwetsWise is the web-based, modular service for the procurement, access and management of subscriptions and online information and now carries a total of 7 787 full text publications from 295 publishers, with more than ninety per cent of the top STM publishers participating.

Dialog adds comprehensive data on adverse drug events
