Crown copyright under review

he Copyright Law Review Committee is reviewing the law covering Crown copyright. The review springs from the recommendation of the Review of Intellectual Property Legislation under the Competition Principles Agreement (the Ergas Committee) that the government should not be provided with preferential treatment under the *Copyright Act*.

Key issues are:

- whether the present law governing crown copyright is appropriate;
- whether as a matter of public policy the government should own copyright in material produced by the executive, judicial and legislative arms of government; and
- what are options for reform, legislative or otherwise, and the costs and benefits of those options.

Users of information should note that the government owns a wide variety of materials, including histories, biographies, maps, promotional brochures, well beyond the usual scope of a government publications library collection.
