The system provides two key components - a digital repository, and tools within which all types of learning content can be stored and individually tailored and adapted.

Factiva adds online content from Guardian Unlimited

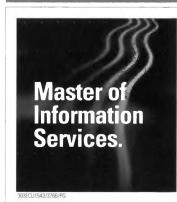
Factiva has announced that online content from Guardian Unlimited is now available to Factiva's 1.6 million global subscribers through Factiva's products and services.
