All of this (and of course more) will be on offer at the ALIA New Librarians' Symposium 2006.

Planning is well underway for the Symposium, to be held in Sydney in December 2006. With the theme 'Pathways and Possibilities', the symposium will

- inspire delegates to explore avenues toward a successful career in the information and library profession;
- include exciting keynote speakers, peer presentations and workshops designed to challenge and build new skills;
- contain a dynamic and energetic mix of sessions on career development, leadership and advocacy; and,
- provide a forum to meet and network with other new graduates, leaders in the industry and associated industry professionals.

Also it's summertime in Sydney, the perfect season to enjoy the city, the beach and good company! The conference will be held 1–2 December 2006 at the University of New South Wales in the fabulous Scientia Building, just a stone's throw from Coogee beach and the delights of the big city.
