## Blackwell launches 3000 years of Digitised Journal Backfiles

Blackwell Publishing has announced the launch of its Journal Backfile Digitisation Program. All issues back to Volume 1, Issue 1 will be digitised for at least 500 journals over the next two- and- a- half years, comprising approximately 6.5 million pages by the time the program is complete.

The first 121 journals to be digitised are available to purchase now and one quarter of these already have their backfiles loaded on Blackwell Synergy. 51 of the journals now available cover social science and humanities subject areas, 37 cover medicine and healthcare, and 33 are from science. The digitised backfiles for these initial 121 titles represent 2.5 million pages and almost 3000 years of content.

#### James Bennett and EBL title data goes live

## Integrated Information Solution now displays Supplementary Protection Certificates (SPC)

Thomson Scientific has announced that Thomson Pharma will now display comprehensive Supplementary Protection Certificate (SPC) expiration dates. Considered the European equivalent of Hatch Waxman – the US law



that allows patent extensions to compensate for time lost while a patented drug gains regulatory approval – SPCs act as a supplement to the patent's protection by coming into force at the expiration date of the drug's patent. Thus, SPCs give the drug owner exclusive rights to market the drug for an additional period.

Formed by a regulation in nine European Union countries and now enacted in 25 European countries (with similar national legislation in Switzerland), an SPC lasts for up to a maximum of five years and was designed to provide up to a maximum of 15 years monopoly on marketed drugs. The SPC is not an automatic right and has to be applied for by the patent owner in each country once a drug has gained marketing authorisation valid in the relevant country, and the drug's patent is granted.

#### Thomson Scientific announces sponsorship with China's State Intellectual Property Office

Thomson Scientific has announced it has secured an exclusive sponsorship deal with China's State Intellectual Property Office (SIPO) to sponsor the SIPO China Intellectual Property News (CIPN) Public Intellectual Property Contest – known as the Thomson Scientific Cup China Public Intellectual Property Knowledge Contest.
