Stay in and around Perth, and there's still lots to see and do: the Perth Mint, King's Park, AQWA (the Aquarium of WA, located at Hillary's marina). Fremantle, or just soak up the sun and sand at any of Perth's pristine beaches. At night, catch a show at the Burswood complex or something classical at the Perth Concert Hall, followed by a night out in cosmopolitan Northbridge, where the State Library is located.

The good news is that there's lots of ways to get to Perth, depending on your budget, your interests and how much time you've got. Of course, it's quickest to fly: direct flights come from Brisbane, Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide and Canberra. If you're coming from Sydney or Adelaide, do one of the world's great train journeys take the famous Indian Pacific. On the train, you'll cross the Nullarbor (literally, 'treeless plain'), famous for its long, deadstraight roads. Which brings us to the other option — grab a few library colleagues and drive across: the quintessential Australian experience. You've always meant to do it one day! Take some holidays and visit Adelaide, maybe see some migrating whales in the Great Australian Bight, admire the perfect beaches and turquoise water at Esperance, perhaps travel via Kalgoorlie and see the aptly-named Super Pit in action.

So come on over and join us for CLICK06 — where you can *create* some time for your professional development at the *leading* conference for information professionals in Australia, learn about the latest *innovative* developments in the industry, *connect* with the experiences of speakers and colleagues, and gain *knowledge* to take back to everyday working life.
