The scholarship is a biennial award of up to \$5000, providing the recipient with an

opportunity to investigate and research a particular project relating to the practice of library technicians, thus increasing the recipient's professional occupational experience. The National Library Technicians Group thanks Apollo-Moon and ALIA for their joint sponsorship of the 2007 scholarship.

Rebecca's project will involve collating and cataloguing photographs, documents and information relating to the historical development of paraprofessional library practice in Australia into a digital database to be housed on ALIA's website. This would have use as an historical record and as a resource for library technician courses. The database will also spearhead

the development of similar databases for other library and related professions. I think I speak for all technicians in saying 'congratulations Rebecca', for receiving this award.

Accounts in Libraries Australia Administration determine:

- which libraries have access to Cataloguing, Search, and Document Delivery
- which users within libraries can access these services, and the functionality and databases available to each user.

Libraries Australia Administration provides customer reports on usage at the library and user level.

Libraries can set up their Record Export Service profiles, order products, and register for Record Import Service via Libraries Australia Administration. You can now download the Libraries Australia Administration Manual from the Manuals section on the Libraries Australia website.
