New Resources for College Libraries (RCL) web edition

In November 2006 Bowker, publisher of Books in Print, and Choice Magazine, and the Association of College and Research Libraries (ACRL) launched the online edition of the new Resources for College Libraries (RCL).

RCLweb, an online database of hand-selected core titles for academic libraries, is the successor to the American Library Association's classic reference work, Books for College Libraries, which was also developed by Choice and last published in its third edition in 1988.

Users can create, edit, and save lists that can then be e-mailed or downloaded and printed. Searching has been made easier, updates are frequent and the resource can be linked with a library's catalogue.

Synergy relaunched by Blackwell
