TAFE Libraries - creative!

Staff in TAFE libraries often prove their creativity in diverse and adverse situations - as funding, resources and space are sometimes an issue. In 2006, ALIA began a slightly different process of course recognition which included combined information sharing meeting for educators. This continued in 2007 with another meeting in conjunction with the National Library and Information Technicians Conference. In October 2008, ALIA will again host representatives from all TAFEs and RTAs teaching the Diploma and other Certificate courses which will be held in Sydney. For the first time this decade, an ALIA course recognition panel will also visit each TAFE and other RTA locations in late 2008 as part of the TAFE course recognition process. Dianne Walton-Sonda, our new Education Manager, is co-ordinating these meetings and visits and keeping in touch with LT educators via the 'Iteducators' e-list and teleconferences

ALIA represented on Cyber-safety Consultative group

ALIA has gained representation on the Government's newly formed Consultative Working Group on Cyber-safety, with the first meeting being held at the end of May. Other members on the Working Group include representatives from child safety organisations, Google, Microsoft, Fox Interactive and the Internet Industry Association.
