Participation in the ALIA PD Scheme is voluntary and free of charge to all eligible ALIA members and provides a broad range of services. These services range from securing discounted registration fees on a wide variety of training opportunities with accredited training companies and institutions, to providing the tools to formally record and demonstrate your ongoing commitment to your professional growth.

One of these tools is ALIA's *Career development kit*. This kit has been designed to assist members and their employers to:

- Define and analyse current skills
- Pinpoint areas which may need further development
- Set professional development goals
- Identify PD activities which will best facilitate the achievement of these goals.

Another tool is ALIA's *PD Scheme user guide*, providing members with the necessary information to participate in the PD Scheme by:

- Clearly defining the requirements and responsibilities of the scheme
- Providing a description of accredited PD activities
- Providing documents for recording your activities
- Providing details of the annual audit process.

The ALIA PD Scheme is held in high regard throughout the library community both here and abroad and is the first step in gaining industry recognition as an Associate Fellow (AFALIA or AFALIATec). Professional development provides us with the building blocks to enhance our skills and further our careers.
