Trust Me! features 46 contributions by some of Australia's best known children's authors, poets and illustrators. Original stories, poems and art cross all genres: mystery, romance, crime, fantasy, Science Fiction, humour and much more.

Short stories are a useful vehicle with which to encourage the reluctant reader. They have a tightness of plot, limitation on characters and their subsequent development; not to forget a smaller number of pages than your average novel. All these positives can give the reader a sense of quiet achievement once a story is completed; a boost to their confidence. However writing successful short stories can be tricky for all the same reasons.

The range and caliber of authors included in the anthology is impressive, vast and varied and magically Australian in voice. Those who have tackled the short story have done so with deft ability, and it is always wonderful to see poetry being offered to young readers.

Having a collection of writing in different genres allows for a range of tastes to be satisfied- it also allows for readers to tackle something new.

face the truth about bullying. Lisa Eskinazi was a victim of extreme school bullying. Her subsequent struggle with depression, hospitalization and homelessness is recorded in diaries that form the basis of the text and the accompanying poems. Lisa had the courage to stand up to those who bullied her (and the school that failed in its duty of care to protect her) by taking her case to court and winning.

Lisa's inspirational story should be read by students, parents and teachers so that they may fully understand the consequences of ignoring the early signs and long-term effects of bullying.
