Making the Right Choice

For librarians in one person, solo or small libraries, the two most common barriers faced in undertaking professional development (PD) are lack of time and lack of funds. To these two barriers I would also add lack of focus; not knowing what to choose when your time and funds are limited.

In tackling the latter issue, it is worthwhile identifying what you consider to be professional development. For me, PD can be any learning activity that helps me improve my skills or knowledge in a specific area and which directly supports my career. Therefore, before undertaking any PD one has to identify (a) area of interest, (b) skills or knowledge gap and (c) learning activity that will support knowledge/skill improvement and professional growth. In this PD planning process you will probably identify several areas of interest, skills gap and supporting learning activities. The next step is to prioritise, taking into consideration your available time, commitments (both work and home) and funds (work or self funded).

Working for a not-for-profit organisation, funding has been a major issue in professional development. As my PD budget is negligible I have had to look at ways of undertaking low cost learning activities that support skill and knowledge improvement.

Following are some suggestions of soft professional development activities which incur minimal or no cost:

- An alternative to attending conferences is to read the conference papers online when they become available.

- Keep your eye out for conferences or seminars which are broadcast over the web; webcasts, webinars (voice only + powerpoint handout), or podcast.

- Join an e-list or online user group to support your new learning area.

- Join a forum which provides both face-to-face meetings and an online discussion.
- Identify free journals in the area of interest and read relevant articles and for additional ALIA Continuing PD points do an article or book review.

- Identify professional associations in the area of interest.
- Find relevant journal articles or books on subject of interest and do some homework
- Find a mentor. ALIA has a mentoring program http://www.alia.org.au/education/pd/mentoring/ which can assist in finding a suitable mentor.

There comes a point when you have to pay for training courses, higher education or conferences and special events. Before deciding on what you are going to put your money into, evaluate your options carefully and ask the following:

- 1. Who is the trainer/presenter; what is their background?
- 2. Is all of the course content relevant to my area of interest?
- 3. Is the course content current?
- 4. Will I be given useful course material?
- 5. How much additional work will I need to do to complete this course?
- Can 1 do something else which will provide the same return (improved knowledge, new skill, etc.) for less cost in terms of money, time and work life

As a final thought, evaluate your learning choices to allow you to learn to know, learn to do, learn to live [work] together and learn to be. Happy learning!
