Information Awareness Month - May 2008

Information Awareness Month (IAM) aims at increasing public awareness of the information industry and the importance of maintaining good records and information, relating to everyone from global corporations through to small business and even the homemaker – in other words 'connecting information and people'.

This year's 'Safety: Security: Privacy' theme is more relevant than ever, in light of the increasing prevalence and notoriety of cases involving Identity Theft, SPAM, E-Mail Scams, Sharing of Personal Information, Electronic Access of Information, Electronic Banking and Credit Card Fraud.

IAM is a collaborative event between various bodies within the records/archiving/information management community including the Records Management Association of Australasia (RMAA), the Australian Society of Archivists (ASA), National Archives of Australia (NAA), Health Information Management Association of Australia (HIMAA), Institute for Information Management (IIM) and the Australian Library and Information Association (ALIA) and is supported by a number of key State Authorities in Australia such as the Public Records Office of Victoria (PROV).
