#### **Election results 2008**

Jan Richards has been elected vice-president (president elect), and will begin her tenure as vicepresident following the May 2008 Annual General Meeting of ALIA. She will take up the presidency in 2009, holding office until the 2010 AGM.

Helen Partridge and Michelle Brennand were elected as directors by the membership at large; Philip Keane was elected director by the institutional members of ALIA. Their terms will run until the 2010 AGM.

Ballot papers distributed: 4868 to members, 955 to institutional members. The ballot count was conducted by Ascent Pty Ltd.

- Vice-president: 836 formal ballot papers were received, with Kevin Dudeney gaining 193 votes, and Jan Richards 643.
- Directors elected by the membership at large: 789 formal ballot papers were received. Brenda McConchie received 187 first preference votes. Gail Schmidt received 202 first preference votes. Kate Sinclair received 301 first preference votes and a total of 476 votes following the distribution of preferences. Helen Partridge received 301 first preference votes, with a total of 513 votes, Michelle Brennand received 340 first preference votes, with a total of 560 votes; these candidates were declared elected. (Exhausted votes 7; total votes 1578)
- Director elected by the institutional members: 83 formal ballot papers were received. Brenda McConchie received 6 first preference votes. Gail Schmidt received 11 first preference votes. The 17 first preference votes for Helen Partridge and the 20 for Michelle Brennand were distributed as they had been previously elected. Kate Sinclair received 11 first preference votes plus 38 distributed votes. Philip Keane received 18 first preference votes plus 44 distributed votes and was declared elected. (Exhausted votes 0; total votes 83)
