ALIA booth at the 2009 Perth Careers Expo

During the course of the three days, over 13 000 people came through the Expo and we recorded genuine requests for information from over 300 visitors. Along with the curious came the comments: "I can't be a librarian because I can't stop talking" and "you have to do a degree to be a librarian?!" The Expo was hailed a success in dispelling these myths and promoting the diverse careers.

Although coordinated by the ALIAWest Committee and the State Library of Western Australia (SLWA), there were endless offers of support during the organisation of the booth. As well as ALIA, library schools that donated course information and handouts were: Queensland University of Technology, Curtin University of Technology, Charles Sturt University, Edith Cowan University, and the Central TAFE.

We also gave away stickers and transfer tattoos from Summer Reading Club 2009, SLWA bookmarks, and wrapped lollies, and a raffle for a guided tour of the back areas of SLAW and four \$25 vouchers for the SLWA Bookshop. Five winners were chosen to attend the tour, which covered hidden areas of the State Library including the acquisitions and distribution, stack, and preservation areas.

Organisers of the ALIA booth also gained enormous satisfaction from the event, developing pride in our profession. The ALIAWest Committee would like to acknowledge State Library of Western Australia in particular for making the 2009 Expo a brilliant success, and thank all the other libraries and institutions for supporting the expo.





