Stephen McVey

Stephen McVey is Director of Library Services at the University of Notre Dame Australia, a private Catholic University with campuses in Broome, Fremantle and Sydney. Stephen has been with the University for 11 years, working previously as a Library Manager and a Liaison Librarian. Prior to this Stephen worked a corporate training role with the Commonwealth Government. Stephen's major interests are the delivery of digital services, both content and discovery, improving customer service and fostering effective teams. Libraries are part of an extremely competitive service industry and the focus of Stephen's keynote presentation will be on applying hospitality service standards in a library context.

Grant Stone – Master of Ceremonies

Grant has 35 years experience working as part of the team

building the material collections of Murdoch University Library, being employed (until October 2010) as the Scholarly Resources Librarian. Grant has a lifelong interest in science fiction and popular culture, although he began his academic career with a B.Sc. (Hons) in botany and zoology completed in 1972. He then studied for a Dip Ed, before studying for a post grad librarianship diploma at WAIT (Curtin), 1975. Grant is a frequent radio broadcaster and has contributed to the weekly review programme, *The Faster Than Light Radio Show* on RTR-FM, and National Public Radio for over 30 years. For two seasons he was part of the ABC-TV team presenting *Can We Help?*

Grant is an Australasian Ambassador for Laughter Yoga and is the Convenor of LaughWA.

Barbara currently lectures for the School of Computing and Security Science (SCSS) at Edith Cowan University. She lectures in Information Services Management, Information Literacy, the Information Society and Literature for Children and Young Adults.
