It's a time to reflect on where Australia has come from, recognising the traditional owners of this land. DIAC supports a range of community events and activities held to celebrate Harmony Day by providing free promotional products and encourages everyone to wear orange, the colour of harmony, on the day.

Harmony Day began in 1999 and since then, a wide variety of groups including sports organisations, community groups, local, state and federal government agencies, schools, and businesses have

staged more than 25 000 Harmony Day events.

Over the years, Harmony Day has grown

in popularity as Australians have made the day their own. What better way to celebrate the allembracing ethos of library and information services than to don something orange and spread the message – everyone belongs at the library!
