Thousands participate in Safer Internet Day

Almost 9000 students across Australia participated in Cybersmart activities on *Safer Internet Day* on 7th February 2012.

More than 1750 students across Australia participated in Cybersmart Networking and Cybersmart Hero activities while another 7000 students participated in online Internet Safety Awareness Presentations, led by Cybersmart's Outreach program.

The theme for this year was Connecting Generations and Educating Each Other. With the Australian Communication and Media Authority's Communications Report 2009-10 research showing that Australians 65 years and older have increased their time spent using the internet by 167% in the past six years; now more than ever, all generations are virtually connected.

"The virtual world is a unique environment where people of all ages and levels of experience can learn together and from each other," says ACMA Deputy Chairman, Richard Bean.

"Tech-savvy young people can teach their grandparents how to use new technologies, while older people can draw on their life experiences to help younger generations stay safe," he said.

In line with the theme of *Safer Internet Day* 2012, Cybersmart also provided helpful information specifically for grandparents. The information is designed to help them keep themselves safe online, while also looking out for their grandchildren. Safer Internet Day is observed in over 60 countries and recognised across Europe, North America, South America and the Asia-Pacific region.
