- Current ALIA Member
- Recently qualified library technician or librarian, or current student in a library technician or library program in Australia. Professionals returning to the workforce after a hiatus are also welcome.
- Limit of three reviews per year.

HOW TO REQUEST A REVIEW

Send an email to alianewgraduatesgroup@gmail.com with the following information:

- 1. Your résumé attached as a Word document (.doc, .docx, or .rtf)
- 2. Subject heading of Résumé review request
- 3. Your name and email address
- 4. Your ALIA number
- 5. The job posting to which you're applying (include an active link or file attachment). If you're not applying for a specific position, describe the type of position you plan to seek, including type of library (eg public, academic, special) and type of duties (eg technical services, reference and instruction)
- 6. A list of any specific aspects of the résumé that you'd like the reviewer to focus on.



WHAT TO EXPECT

You will receive a reply from your reviewer within two weeks with advice on how to improve your résumé.
