LONG SERVICE LEAVE (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1985

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The object of this Bill is to amend the Long Service Leave Act, 1955 ("the Act"), so as—

- (a) to reduce the qualifying period for long service leave by providing for the accrual and grant of long service leave under the Act after a worker has completed 10 years service with an employer and thereafter at the completion of each 5 years service (Schedule 1 (1) (a)-(f));
- (b) to extend the amount of long service leave to which a worker is entitled under the Act by the number of days, if any, on which public holidays fall during a period of long service leave taken by the worker (Schedule 1 (1) (g) and (h)); and
- (c) to provide that the basis of entitlement to long service leave shall be the continuous service of a worker under one or more contracts of employment instead of service under an unbroken contract of employment (Schedule 1 (1) (i) and (j)).

Schedule 2 of the Bill contains amendments by way of statute law revision.

The Bill also contains provisions of a consequential, saving or transitional nature.
